1.0 Introduction

Statutory public consultation on the Tailored amendment to *Brisbane City Plan 2014*: Long term infrastructure plans amendment 1B (LTIP amendment 1B) was undertaken between 3 August and 14 September 2023. The LTIP amendment 1B is proposing changes to ensure the LTIP remains accurate, relevant and current for identifying and preserving Brisbane's long term infrastructure needs.

Council received 54 submissions on the LTIP amendment 1B. Submissions received after the closing date were still given full consideration.

It is important to note that the proposed LTIP amendment 1B may be subject to further changes required by the Queensland Government during the Minister for Housing, Local Government, Planning and Public Works' consideration.

2.0 Engagement activities

Council notified the proposed amendments in the following manner:

In alignment with the State Government's Minister's Guidelines and Rules (Chapter 5, Part 3, Section 11), and Council's commitment to transparency, letters were sent to landowners whose properties are adjacent to sites included in a proposed draft amendment.

The LTIP is a strategic document which informs long-term financial and land use planning; it does not override established financial decision-making, budget-setting, project planning or approval processes. If new or upgraded infrastructure is ultimately determined to be required, the relevant project will progress to detailed planning, where specific requirements and direct landowner impacts will be identified and managed.
